PANCAKES, CROCODILES, BUBBLE GUM, AND MORE - Paula Lopatic, Children's Librarian, Vespasian Warner Public Library, Clinton, IL will share the books, stories, crafts, and games that combine to make afterschool events full of fun. Discover programs that have been used successfully with students in K through 5th grade.

UNDER INVESTIGATION: ANCESTRY DETECTIVE STRATEGIES - The fragments of your family history are scattered throughout this country, and beyond. This session, led by *Iris Nelson, Reference Librarian, Quincy Public Library*, will give you the tools and savvy to begin your research, fit together the puzzle pieces, and view the whole picture. Do you muse about what life was like for your ancestor? Included will be suggestions on giving context to the lives of your family members.

BARCODER CERTIFICATION? - Have you ever had a patron request an item, only to have something totally different arrive? Were they angry or disappointed? The Illinois State Library and the Statewide Cataloging Standards Committee (SCSC) are working together to try and decrease the likelihood of this happening to you or your patron. Thus far the SCSC has created the Statewide Cataloging Standards and a barcoder certification test, which they hope will help in assessing the training needs of all individuals who are inputting data into our consortial catalogs. Doris McKay, Rolling Prairie Library System Consultant and member of SCSC, will discuss the certification exam and the Statewide Cataloging Standards, as well as provide information about training resources available to you.

MANAGE YOUR STUFF & CONQUER CLUTTER! - Stacks of paper, shelves full of knickknacks, books piled on the floor, clothes you haven't worn since high school!! In the attic, a narrow aisle between stacked boxes you haven't opened in years! You own lots of Stuff, and now your Stuff owns you! Help! Need to get organized and get rid of the clutter in your life? Thea Chesley, Librarian, Illinois Department of Public Health, Springfield, IL will provide guidelines, tips and tricks for stuff management. You'll learn at least one thing (and probably several more) that you can use right away to get organized and get your clutter under control.

PLINKIT: AN INTERACTIVE WEB SITE FOR EVERY LIBRARY - If your library does not have a website, you are missing an opportunity to promote your library to the people vou serve both those that use the library and those that do not. Plinkit is a product based on open source software that allows even the smallest libraries to have a well-designed and easy to maintain web page. Plinkit was created at the Oregon State Library. Illinois Library Systems have brought this product to Illinois with the aid of an LSTA Grant from the Illinois State Library. At this session Beverly Obert, Executive Director, Rolling Prairie Library System, will demonstrate how easy it is to update a Plinkit website and also show examples of websites that were created during the first year of the grant.

Recognize the similarities and differences between acute stress and chronic stress and how each affects a person's health. 2. Apply the concepts of acute and chronic stress to your personal situation. 3. Utilize the concepts learned to manage stress in new ways. 4. Practice stress relief techniques.

**GREENING YOUR LIBRARY - Kevin Greene, Illinois EPA** will identify opportunities for library facilities to save energy, reduce waste, and purchase environmentally friendly products.

EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES FOR LIBRARY WORKERS - This session will highlight the College of DuPage Library Technology programs that are offered via Internet and two-way video. These are available for any level of library worker from the beginner to the refresher for the MLS librarian, to the school media person. 
**ELDER ABUSE -** The Illinois Crime Victim's Compensation Program allows victims of violent crimes or their survivors to receive compensation for hospital and doctor bills, rehabilitation, loss of wages, tuition, and funeral/burial expenses when other sources of funding have been exhausted, such as insurance and court ordered restitution. Delores Martin, Director and Deputy Clerk, Court of Claims, Secretary of State's Office and Kim Murray, Outreach Specialist, Crime Victim Services Division, Office of the Illinois Attorney General will talk about the Assistance for Elderly Victims of Violence which is an extension of the Illinois Crime Victim's Compensation Program that provides elderly crime victims access to much needed resources in getting back to living their regular
